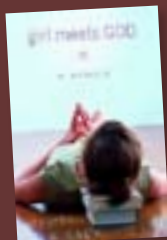

## Charitable Tax Report

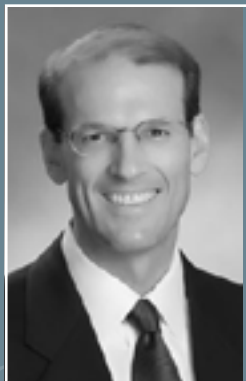

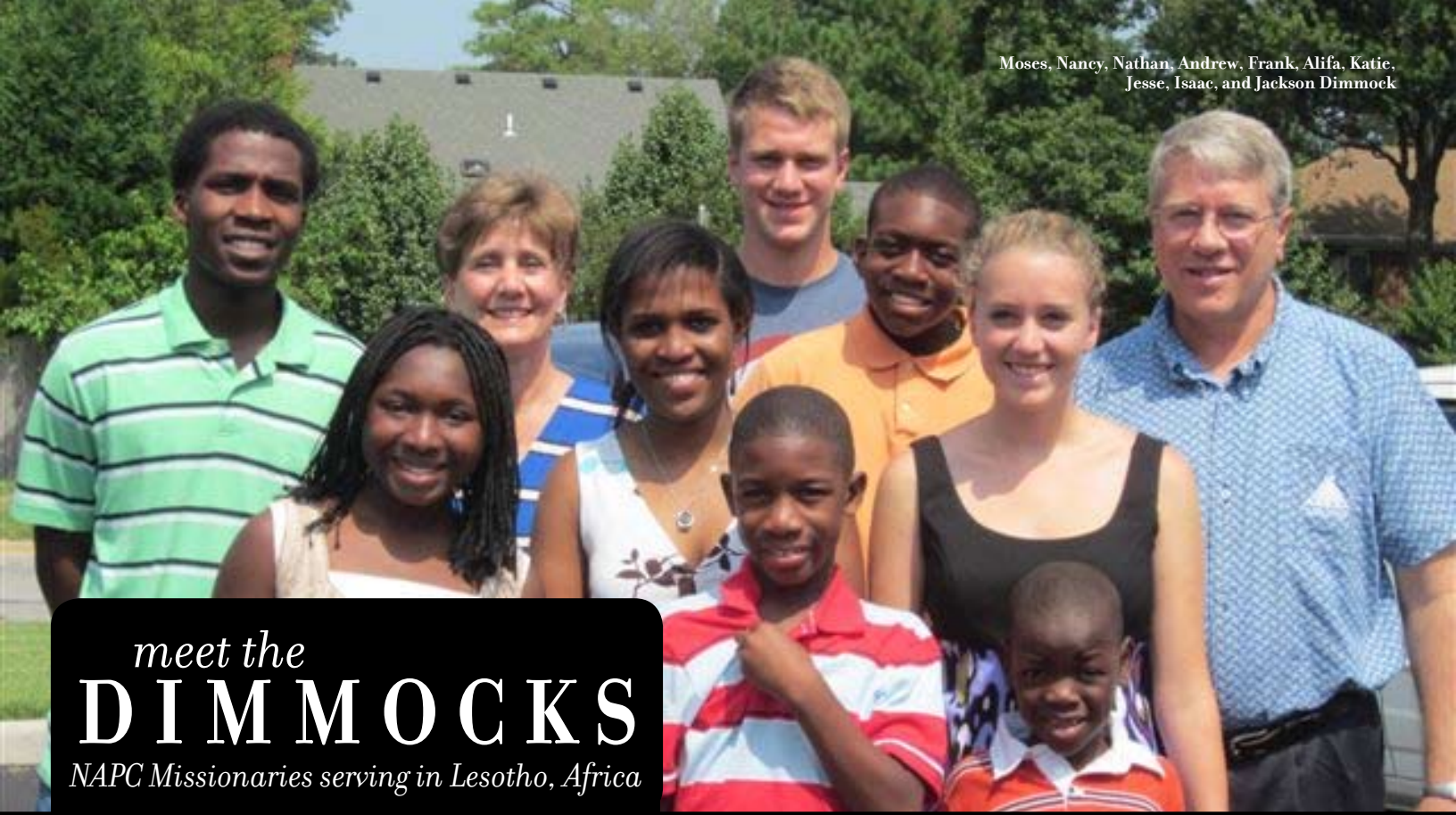

NAPC Missionaries serving in Lesotho, Africa

**W**e laughed as our interview began and Nancy's phone rang with a ringtone singing "Don't Worry, Be Happy." It's a good life motto for a family living as missionaries in Lesotho, Africa with eight children ranging in age from 7-25.

Lesotho is a tiny country—about the size of Maryland—totally surrounded by the Republic of South Africa. Outside the major cities, most people exist on subsistence farming, making food insecurity a problem. Lesotho also has the third highest rate of HIV infection in the world. Describing life in Lesotho, Nancy said, "Life over there is so much... grittier. You're surviving. You're making choices about where to get water, about how to replenish your electricity, about adequate food supply."

Frank and Nancy Dimmock first arrived in Lesotho as missionary newlyweds in 1985. Over the years they have also served in Malawi and Congo. They both have unique stories about what led them to serve as long-term missionaries. Frank initially committed to a year between college and graduate school to volunteer in Congo after hearing a missionary speak at his church in North Carolina. That year turned into two, and through that experience, he realized God was calling him to full time mission work, with training in public health. Nancy grew up in the DR Congo and came to the States for college. She recalled, "I was counting the days until I could leave this country and go back. But God really had to do a work in my heart to make me emotionally stay and learn what he had to teach me... What that turned out to be was that it's a matter

of obedience. People are everywhere needing love, needing a witness... the geography isn't what it's all about."

Frank currently serves with the PC(USA) as Africa Health Liaison, where he represents the PC(USA) to its partner churches as well as hospitals, clinics and primary health programs in nine African countries. He also spends about half of his time working specifically with children's ministries. Nancy currently works with individual

or smaller groups of children who need a home. In 2009 Nancy partnered with a local colleague to create Ministry of Hope—Lesotho. The organization researches the backgrounds of kids who are institutionalized and tries to find original or new families for them.

North Avenue members have interacted with some of those children on short term mission trips to Lesotho. In particular, two groups visited the Ministry of Insured Salvation (MIS) Orphanage—one of the locations Nancy works with via

Ministry of Hope. MIS is where the Dimmocks found their daughter Katie (six of their children are adopted—two from Lesotho, one from Atlanta, and three from Malawi) twenty years ago. The Dimmocks stayed connected with the MIS, and questioning how to appropriately address some of the many needs at that orphanage was one of the motivations to start Ministry of Hope.

During North Avenue's first short term mission trip to Lesotho, NAPC member Leigh Kershner met a little boy named Sechaba with pressing medical needs at the orphanage. Because of North Avenue's established relationship with the Dimmocks, Leigh and her husband Greg were able to later write to the Dimmocks asking how they could help Sechaba. Children at MIS were not being placed with new families, but the Kershners' questions opened up the possibility of adoption in that orphanage. Sechaba was adopted by Leigh and Greg in 2010 and is now a part of the North Avenue family. Since then, 42 children from MIS have been placed or gone to their new families.

When asked how North Avenue can better support them, Frank replied, "The prayer support is the most important. We can sense that people are praying for us when times are tough." Specifically, Frank asked for prayer as he interacts with children who have been traumatized, particularly through the growing phenomenon of accusations of witchcraft. In many areas of the African continent, there is culture of belief that there is a reason for any kind of bad experience, and often children are victimized and accused of causing that bad thing to happen. Those children are exorcised, tortured or rejected by their communities and are now living on the street. Frank asks for prayer as he helps partner churches reach out and rehabilitate those children. Nancy asked for prayer for their own children as Andrew and Alifa prepare to leave for boarding school in Kenya. Nancy said, "Part of the struggle or sacrifice of being missionaries is, 'What happens with our kids?' The need for a good education that's not available where you're assigned. That's what we're facing when we go back next school-year."

The Dimmocks will be worshipping with us at North Avenue in the upcoming months; say hello and a word of thanks. 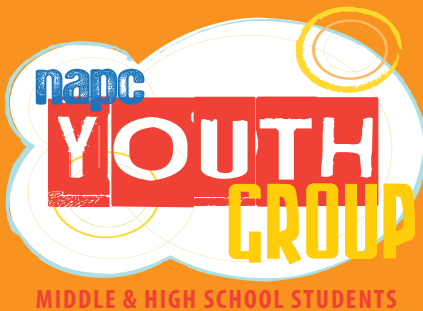

### PARTNER UPDATE ATLANTA CHILDREN'S SHELTER EXPANDS IN 2012.

You'll be seeing some changes at the Atlanta Children's Shelter in 2012 as they expand their facilities. additional space includes a new classroom (helping the shelter reduce the child to teacher ratio), new Parent Training Center that will provide dedicated training space and computer lab to parents, addition of two private counseling rooms, and the addition of a private health exam room allowing children and their parents to receive weekly preventive healthcare onsite in an appropriate setting. Construction will begin during the second week of January and is scheduled to be completed by the end of April.

## Sharing the Gospel with a New Generation

Chinese children remind me of the first time I came to church. Because I had an atheist education, I did not come to seek God, but to improve my English. But when I heard the good news of the Kingdom and saw the good deeds of Christians, I was touched by their love, and my heart changed. Similarly, scholars are bringing their children to learn English and experience American culture.

Twelve years into international ministry at Georgia Tech, Chinese scholars are not new to North Avenue. But this year, God does bring us something new. More scholars are coming to the United States with their families and they bring them to the church. These Chinese children range in age from 3 to 10 years old. The new environment and language barrier obviously have an impact on their lives here; we felt that these children needed special attention

while their parents attend Sunday School and the worship service. In August, with the help of Roxie Chess, we began a special Sunday School with Chinese children from 5 to 10 years old. During the regular Sunday School hour, we lead them in the big class with American kids taught by Roxie. From 11 a.m.-12 p.m., we keep them in a small group to reinforce in Chinese what Roxie taught in English. This helps the kids to learn English and understand the lesson.

We are grateful for your support for the Chinese ministry. With more Chinese children coming, the ministry extends to the new generation. In addition to Sunday school, we plan to expand this ministry by hosting periodical seminars during the Sunday lunch hour where Christians share their life values, particularly as it relates to families and parenting. May we cherish this opportunity and be used by God for His glory. -*Jasmine Shi*
