There have been a lot of new beginnings in the past month around NAPC: Dr. Mark Brewer began a season of ministry with us as Interim Pastor, our 10 Adult Discipleship classes and several Chinese discipleship classes kicked off on Sunday, Aug. 18, 10 eighth graders began a school-year long process of study and preparation in anticipation of Confirmation on Sunday, May 3, and our children and Youth have resumed their discipleship classes on Sunday mornings. We have been intentional in using the word, “Discipleship” more than “Sunday School” so that we might be always mindful that we engage Scripture through study, fellowship, and prayer for the purpose of being formed into the likeness of Jesus Christ. Jeffrey Greenman in his book, “Life in the Spirit: Spiritual Formation in Theological Perspectives,” defines our Spiritual Formation into disciples of Christ as, “our continuing response to the reality of God’s grace shaping us into the likeness of Jesus Christ, through the work of the Holy Spirit, in the community of faith, for the glory of God and for the sake of the world.”

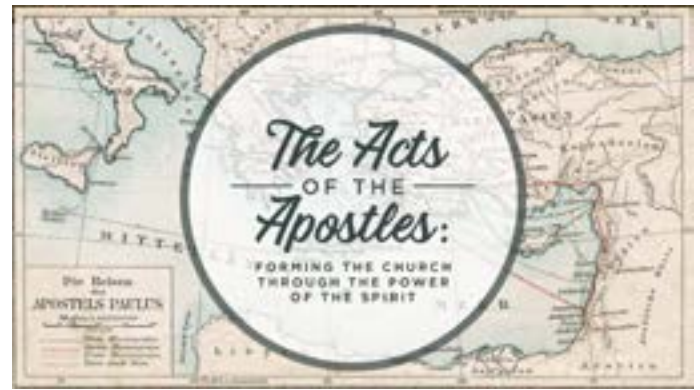

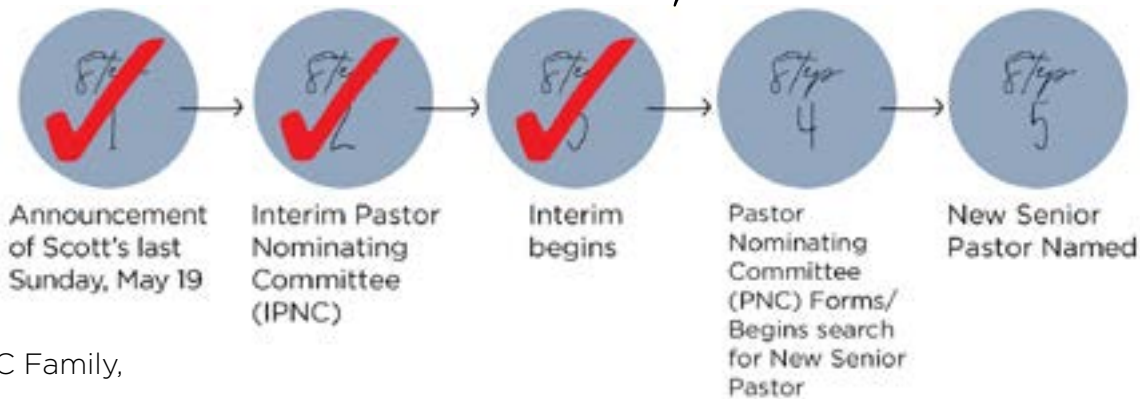

It has been a great first month with our Interim Senior Pastor, Dr. Mark Brewer. We look forward to learning more about him and following his leadership during this Transition.

Prayer - Please continue to pray often for all of us during this time of change. Pray daily for the Weimers, the Brewers, and the person who will be called as the new Senior Pastor. Also, pray for the whole transition process as many people (staff and members) are doing extra tasks during this period of opportunity. Your grace and prayers are felt and needed. The following are opportunities for prayer:

- Corporate prayer on Sundays from 8:15-8:50 a.m. in the Library
- Pause for Prayer wherever you are on Wednesdays at 2 p.m.

Congregational Survey - Thank you for taking the TCI survey and for "Having Your Say." The number of responses to the survey was excellent, and 291 people participated. The results of the survey will help inform the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and senior pastor candidates of the heart and calling of the congregation, and the results will also help guide NAPC's future trajectories. In conjunction with the survey, Leighton Ford Ministries conducted six small Focus Groups to gain further insight. We expect the final report from Leighton Ford Ministries, which incorporates the survey results and input from the Focus Groups, to be released in September or October.

Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) - The Congregational Meeting to elect the PNC will be held as a continued meeting after both morning services on September 8. A letter and an email introducing the PNC candidates will be sent the first week of September. These seven people need to be in our daily prayers. The NAPC Human Resources Team and the Transition Team, with input from the Elders and staff, took over two months to pray for and discuss the 120 individuals who were recommended to serve our church through the PNC. In the October newsletter, we will introduce the elected PNC and discuss the PNC process.

PNC Process

Questions and Answers

How long will the PNC process take? - It is not unusual for the process to take two years.

Why does the process take so long? - Before a PNC can begin considering candidates for Senior Pastor, they must first attend the work outlined by our Presbyterian Polity that expresses who we are - from our demographics to our theological calling. The survey you completed earlier this summer will be an excellent resource for this work. The PNC will further work to identify the heart and calling of North Avenue through conversations they have as a committee as well as through potential conversations with members of the congregation and staff. The PNC's first task is to paint an honest and forward-looking picture of who we are and who God is calling us to be in order to establish a foundational reference point for those whom God may be calling to serve in ministry here.

The process can also take a long time because few pastors with whom the PNC builds a relationship with are not immediately able to leave their current place of ministry in order to begin at NAPC. We may need to wait for someone to come to a natural point of transition in his or her church before transitioning to NAPC.

Will we get updates from the PNC regarding their progress and the candidates they are considering? - No, the PNC process is 100% confidential. Most potential Senior Pastor candidates are actively serving a church, and, if they are not selected by NAPC, they will stay in their current pastorate. If you are hearing rumors about the search, I hope you will communicate this concern with the Chair of the PNC.

What guidance has the PNC been given? - Near the beginning of their journey, the PNC will meet with representatives from the Presbytery to explain the process and with the NAPC Transition Team to receive the results of TCI survey and other information. The Transition Team will be available to assist the PNC in obtaining any information they may need during the search process.

How can the congregation stay involved? - The most important thing we all can do is pray. We can also continue to be actively involved in the life and ministry of NAPC. If you have input on the type of person you desire for NAPC or if you know about a pastor who should receive consideration, please communicate your thoughts to a PNC member. Please trust though, that the PNC will also be taking into consideration the results of the survey which directly convey the input received from "Having Your Say."
